2020 Northeast Asia Peace and Cooperation Forum

A New Vision for Regional Confidence Building

December 3-4, 2020

Institute of Foreign Affairs and National Security (IFANS)
Korea National Diplomatic Academy (KNDA)

I. Background

Northeast Asia is a region in need of greater multilateral cooperation given its geographical proximity and strengthened economic interdependence epitomized by trade and the rise of global/regional value chains. It is more so in the face of recent periodic outbreak of infectious diseases and natural disasters that require a coordinated cross-border response. Major countries in Northeast Asia, however, have shown a preference to rely on bilateral arrangements rather than multilateral measures. Recently, it has become more difficult to form a common consensus on regional issues due to the intensifying strategic competition among major powers and unsolved security agendas including the North Korean nuclear issue, thus nurturing instability in bilateral relations and hindering the existing multilateral endeavors. The constraints stemming from dealing the hard issues are making it difficult to better cooperate even in other soft issue areas.

Calls have been made at various levels for a discussion framework to develop a full-functioning multilateral platform in the region. Multilateral cooperation among regional powers have been developed at a comprehensive level of strengthening its relations, but efforts to share each country's vision and goals in the areas of peace building and security, and to broaden their consensus in such areas, have made relatively little progress. Republic of Korea, meanwhile, has been putting a high priority on advancing the projects aimed at facilitating multilateral discussions which could serve to iron out mutual misunderstandings in the short run and ultimately contribute to a granted regional peace and security. In line with these efforts, at the 8th China-Japan-Korea Trilateral Summit held in 2019, the three Heads of State concurred on the need for academic discussions stating in its outcome document that *"we will keep our joint efforts to further enhance regional dialogue and trust, including holding academic discussions under the framework of Trilateral Cooperation with participations from other relevant partners."*

It is worth noting that the Eastern and Western-Bloc countries created together several multilateral security arrangements that played certain roles even at the climax of the Cold War. The key members of the NATO and the Warsaw Pact grappled with security challenges under the CSCE umbrella. The "Helsinki process" launched in the 1970s designed a set of initial confidence-building measures, and in 1980s, Operational Arms Control was introduced at the Stockholm Conference. In 1990s, the CSCE conference in Vienna introduced Structural Arms Control, and the Treaty on Conventional Armed Forces in Europe (CFE) was concluded. The answer does not necessarily lie in simply applying the CSCE's arms control regime to the Northeast Asian context, but lessons learned from Europe's case of "non-confrontational approach to hostile confrontation" could stimulate constructive discussion on ways to navigate security challenges facing the region. A new picture with a multilateral framework in which various regional players interact would work to remedy the shortcomings of the existing architecture by minimizing structural instability and unnecessary dissonance.

II. Program (tentative)

At this backdrop, the Institute of Foreign Affairs and National Security (IFANS) of the Korea National Diplomatic Academy (KNDA) is preparing to convene the 2020 *Northeast Asia Peace Cooperation Forum* addressing such agendas on December 3-4, 2020. We hope to bring together distinguished scholars and experts to discuss confidence-building measures in the region under the theme of “A New Vision for Regional Confidence Building”.

The Forum aims to provide an open and flexible venue, in which all regional experts can share their views on pressing issues of the region and explore new opportunities for multilateral cooperation. So, participation in the Forum will not be limited to experts from countries within the region but also include renowned experts from other relevant countries and entities.

Through a diverse and lively discussion, we hope to be able to diagnose the latest developments and pending issues in the region, share the vision each country has for future challenges and changes in the regional structure, and explore multilateral framework alternatives for peace and security cooperation in the region.

IFANS is planning a two-day webinar composed of three sessions (the first two open to the public and the latter a closed one) that will be held at the Hotel Shilla in Seoul for resident experts and via online participation for those from abroad.
